The Technical Services Department provides environmental, natural resource, and land-based technical support through monitoring, assessment, and community engagement.

## Your Impact Starts Here

The **Environmental Technician** will provide hands-on field support to the Technical Services Department by assisting departmental staff during environmental field activities. This position is intended as a learning and skills-development opportunity and does not involve independent fieldwork. The technician will work under direct supervision and mentorship while supporting environmental monitoring, sampling, and data collection activities.

The Environmental Technician will work under the direct supervision of the Technical Services Manager and departmental staff. The position includes daily to weekly supervision, informal feedback, and team-based mentoring during all field activities. The technician will not work independently.

## Key Responsibilities:

- Assist the Natural Resources Advisor, Mineral Development Advisor, Environmental Advisor, and Environmental Health Officer during field activities.
- Support water sampling activities, including preparation, collection, labeling, handling, and storage of water samples in accordance with established procedures.
- Assist with benthic invertebrate sampling using the kick-and-sweep method under direct supervision.
- Participate in climate change and environmental monitoring activities as assigned.
- Support community engagement sessions related to environmental and natural resource initiatives, including setup and logistical assistance.
- Accurately record field data, following data collection protocols and quality control requirements.
- Prepare, calibrate, and stock field equipment and supplies before field days.
- Conduct post-field cleanup, organization, storage, and inventory of equipment and materials.
- Follow all health and safety procedures, including safe work practices in outdoor and waterway environments.
- Participate in job-specific training, mentoring, and feedback sessions to build environmental fieldwork skills.

## Qualifications:

- Be between 15 and 30 years of age on July 6, 2026.
- Experience working with Indigenous communities and cultural awareness.
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills.
- Strong organizational and multitasking abilities.
- Proficiency in Microsoft Office and social media platforms.
- Must successfully complete a Level One Police Record Check
- Preferred education level: High school to college (environmental studies, natural resources, or related fields are an asset).
- Interest in environmental monitoring, natural resources, or climate-related work.
- Ability to work outdoors in physically active field conditions.
- Strong attention to detail and willingness to follow established procedures.
- Ability to work well as part of a team and take direction from supervisors.

## Work Environment

- This position is primarily field based, involving outdoor work in varied weather conditions, including work in and around waterways.
- Some office-based tasks such as data entry, equipment preparation, and documentation will also be required.
