Nokiiwin staff are here to help! Keep an eye out for people wearing Nokiiwin nametags.




Junior Spirit Builders are also volunteering during this event and are wearing purple name tags.





This is a chance to be close to Mother Earth. At the Unity Gathering we work to respect nature and minimize our environmental impact.


We will look for ways to keep each other and ourselves safe and healthy during the Unity Gathering.


